After Your Pump or Stimulator Is Placed

Self-care at home

This handout gives instructions to follow at home after you have had a pump or stimulator placed.

	When you	leave the	e hospital	. vou w	vill have
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- ☐ An abdominal binder.
- ☐ A soft C-collar.
- ☐ A sling. Wear the sling at all times for 6 to 8 weeks, except when you are showering or in bed.

Incision Care

- 48 hours after surgery, remove the dressing (bandage).
- Gently clean your incision(s) with Hibiclens. Repeat this cleaning with Hibiclens once a day for 7 days.
- Do not put any dressing or ointment on your incision(s). If your clothing irritates the area, you may place light gauze over it.

Activity

- If any activity causes pain, stop doing that activity.
- Avoid vigorous exercises in physical therapy for 10 days. Have your physical therapist (PT) contact us for specific instructions.
- You can shower after you have removed your dressing.
- Do **not** twist or bend.
- Do **not** lift anything that weighs more than 5 pounds.
- Do **not** lift anything up higher than your shoulders until your doctor says it is OK.
- Do **not** take a bath, sit in a hot tub, or go swimming for 4 weeks after your procedure.

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When to Call the Center for Pain Relief

Call 206-598-4282, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, if you have any of these symptoms:

- Fever higher than 100°F (37.8°C)
- Changes in your incision(s):
 - Bloody or cloudy drainage
 - Increased swelling
 - An incision opens
- Weakness that is getting worse
- You are not able to urinate or have a bowel movement
- Severe headache

Medicine

- After your surgery, you may start taking your usual medicines again.
- You will also take one of these antibiotics after your surgery:
 - ☐ Keflex 500 mg by mouth, 2 times a day for 10 days (until the medicine is gone)

OR

☐ Clindamycin 300 mg by mouth, 2 times a day for 10 days (until the medicine is gone)

Pain Medicine

If your doctor prescribes pain medicine for you, take it exactly as directed.
