How to Prepare

1 Day Before	On Test Day

• Do not eat anything after midnight the night before your test.	• As soon as you get up on the day of your exam, take your morning medicines with 1 cup of water.
• You may drink clear fluids such as juice (apple, grape, or cranberry), broth, black coffee or tea,	• Do not take anything by mouth starting 2 hours before your appointment time. This includes no chewing gum, smoking, or mints.
lemonade, sports-drinks, soda pop, or Jell-O until 2 hours before your appointment time.	What to Bring
	Bring a list of all medicines you take.
	Bring replacement supplies for your ileostomy.
	If You Have Sedation
	If you will have <i>sedation</i> (medicine to make you relax) for your ileoscopy, follow these instructions in addition to the ones above:
	• Plan to arrive 30 minutes before your appointment time.
	• An adult family member or friend must pick you up when you are ready to go home. You cannot drive, take a bus or taxi, or use a service such as Hopelink or Paratransit by yourself after your test. Your test will be cancelled if you do not have an adult family member or friend to take you home.
	• We strongly advise that a responsible adult stay with you for the rest of the day.

Special Instructions

- **If you have diabetes:** Your diabetes medicines will need to be adjusted. Please talk with your diabetes care provider to plan a schedule for your diabetes medicines for the day of your procedure.
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What to Expect

You are scheduled for an *ileoscopy*. This test allows your doctor to look at the lining of your small intestine.

- Your doctor will place a flexible tube through your ostomy. The tube is about the size of a finger.
- You might have some cramping during the test. Your doctor may take *biopsies* (tissue samples), but you will not feel this.
- The test takes about 15 minutes. Your appointment will last longer because of the time it takes to prepare for the test and to allow for your recovery.
- Your doctor will talk with you about the results. If results are not ready right after the test, your doctor will tell you when you can expect us to call you.
