| Resources | Doctor: Coordinates care and will follow up in clinic. Ostomy Nurse: Specialist in ostomy care who may meet with you before, during, and/or after your hospital stay to answer questions and assist in coordinating care. Outpatient/Clinic Nurse: Cares for and educates you before and after your inpatient hospital stay. Inpatient Nurse: Cares for you while you are in the hospital post surgery. Will assist with coordinating consults, providing initial supplies, and education. Social Worker: Assists with housing, transportation, arranging for supplies after discharge, and home health services. Dietitian: Assists in meal planning, and discusses with you how to meet your nutritional needs. Physical Therapy (PT): Assists with mobility issues, strengthening exercises, and walking. Occupational Therapy (OT): Assists with activities of daily living such as bathing, dressing, eating, etc. United Ostomy Association: Local support group that has volunteers available to meet with you at any time around your surgery.
