Week 1 After Surgery ☐ For **2 months** after surgery, do not lift anything that weighs more than 10 pounds. (A gallon of water weighs almost 9 pounds.) ☐ For 1 week, you may have only sponge baths. Do not shower or cover the exit site with water until your NKC peritoneal dialysis nurse or your doctor tells you it is OK. ☐ Do **not** remove your bandage. Your NKC peritoneal dialysis nurse or surgeon will remove it after about 7 days. ☐ Read your discharge education teaching handout. Follow the instructions on catheter care and how to keep it clean, covered, and dry. Call the number on the handout if you have any problems with your catheter. ☐ Call your NKC peritoneal dialysis nurse if you have any questions or problems after discharge. **Day After Discharge** ☐ Your NKC peritoneal dialysis nurse will call to check on you. ☐ You will get a call from NKC to schedule your first catheter flush. 3 to 5 Days After Discharge ☐ Your first catheter flush will be done at NKC.
