什么是上消化道内窥镜检查?

上消化道内窥镜检查可让您的医生看到您食道(从您的口腔到您的胃管子)的内 膜、胃部及小肠的第一部分。

在检查期间、医生会将一根与小指一般粗细的软管放置到您的口腔内、进入您的胃 及小肠。 这管子不会阻碍到呼吸。

如何做上消化道内窥镜检查?

- 会给您一些镇静剂帮助您放松。这药物是经由静脉以一个很小的导管称为静脉 注射 (IV)
- 大多数病人会睡着。如您无法入睡、且感觉有些不适就请告诉我们。我们会尽 力帮助您舒服。
- 必要时、您的医生也可能会取活检。您不会有感觉、因为在那层组织里没有末 梢神经。
- 此检查仅需 15 分钟。因为需要时间准备及恢复、您在诊所可能会逗留较长的 时间。

我如何获取检查结果?

做完之后、您的医生可能会与您讨论结果。如您的结果不能马上出来、我们就会告 诉您何时可以收到结果。

 If you take blood-thinning medicines such as Coumadin (warfarin) or Plavix (clopidogrel): Call the provider who prescribed these medicines. Tell the provider that you are having an upper endoscopy (EGD), and the date of your procedure. Ask for special instructions for your blood-thinning medicines. Cancellations: If you need to cancel or reschedule your procedure, please call 206 Discharge and transportation: An adult family member or friend must pick you up when you are ready to go home. You cannot drive, take a bus or taxi, or use a service such as Hopelink or Paratransit by yourself after your test. Your test will be cancelled if you do not have an adult family member or friend to take you home. We strongly advise that a responsible adult stay with you for the rest of the day. 	 If you have diabetes: Call the provider who manages your diabetes medicines. Tell the provider that you are having an upper endoscopy (EGD), and the date of your procedure. Ask for special instructions for your diabetes medicines. 	 Do not eat anything after midnight the night before your procedure. As soon as you get up in the morning, take your morning medicines with water. Until 2 hours before your procedure, you can drink clear fluids (fluids you can see through). These include juice (apple, grape, or cranberry), broth, black coffee, tea without milk, sports drinks, soda, or Jell-O (green or yellow only). Leave valuables at home, or keep them safe with your driver or escort What to bring to your appointment: An adult family member or friend A list of all medicines you currently take Photo ID, insurance care, and co-pay, if needed At the hospital: You must remove all jewelry and piercings before the procedure. If you can, leave all valuables at home, or give them to your family member or friend for safekeeping.

What is an upper endoscopy?

An upper endoscopy lets your doctor look at the lining of your *esophagus* (the tube that goes from your mouth to your stomach), your stomach, and the first part of your small intestine.

During the exam, a flexible tube, about the width of a little finger, will be placed into your mouth and down into your stomach and small intestine. This tube will not get in the way of your breathing.

What to Expect

- You will receive a *sedative* (relaxation medicine) to help you relax. This medicine will be given to you through a small tube called an *intravenous* (IV) line placed into one of your veins.
- Most people fall asleep. But, if you do not fall asleep and are feeling some discomfort, we will do our best to help you be comfortable.
- If needed, your doctor may take small tissue samples called *biopsies*. You will not feel this because there are no nerve endings in that layer of tissue.
- Your doctor may also *dilate* (expand) narrow areas or stop bleeding inside your small intestine.
- This test will take only about 15 minutes, but you will be in the hospital longer than that, to allow time for you to prepare for the exam and recover afterward.

How do I get the test results?

When you wake up after the procedure, your doctor will talk with you about the results. If your results are not ready right after the exam, we will tell you when you can expect to receive them.
