Copay Assistance and Medication Assistance Programs

- **Brain Tumor Drug Copayment Assistance Program:** This program is part of the Musella Foundation for Brain Tumor Research and Information. It provides financial assistance to families who need help covering the cost of certain drugs used to treat Primary Malignant Brain Tumors (Grade 3 or 4). - **Blood Cancer United:** This organization offers financial assistance for people living with lymphoma and other blood cancers. Learn more at bloodcancerunited.org/financial-assistance
- **NF1 Copay Assistance:** PAN's neurofibromatosis medication copay grant helps you afford out-of-pocket costs for covered prescription medications, listed below. PAN also offers a [neurofibromatosis health insurance premium grant](#) to help you afford your insurance premium that covers neurofibromatosis treatment. Non-medical Expenses

- **ABTA:** The Glenn Garcelon Fund (GGF) offers a grant up to \$1,000 for patients with a primary brain tumor. This grant can help pay for bills directly (such as mortgage, rent, utilities, car payments, medical bills, etc.). They will ask for a copy of the bill you would like support with when you apply.
