Before, during, and after your hospital stay

Before Surgery Day of Surgery At home before surgery ☐ You will get education about the procedure Sign Forms and sign consent forms for surgery. ☐ Take another shower with the prescription antibacterial soap. On this call you will discuss ☐ If **not** donating through National Kidney Registry, please arrive at the 3rd floor lab at 6:30 am. check-in location and what medicines to take ☐ If donating through National Kidney Registry, please arrive at the 3rd floor lab 30 minutes (if needed) the morning of your surgery. prior to your designated check-in time. ☐ The night before surgery, take a shower with ☐ Check in at either Admitting or Surgical Pavilion the prescription antibacterial soap. Clear Liquids (as you were told on the phone call from Pre-Anesthesia). ☐ Do not eat or drink anything after midnight except ☐ A nurse will take you to the pre-op area. clear liquids (such as water or apple juice). ☐ An IV line will be placed in your arm to give you antibiotics, fluids, and pain medicine. ☐ We will give you a heating blanket to keep you warm. ☐ The care team will prepare you for surgery. ☐ Anesthesiology will take you to the operating room. ☐ You will be in the operating room between 3 to 5 hours. Your surgeon will contact your caregiver once you are out of surgery. After surgery ☐ After surgery you will recover in the post-anesthesia unit for a few Water hours before being moved to 7SA for the remainder of your stay. ☐ You will be allowed to chew gum, if you have some. ☐ You will be given sips of water and ice chips to chew. ☐ You will have a *Foley catheter* (tube) in your bladder to drain urine for at least 2 days. ☐ Nurses will take vital signs while you are sitting on the edge of bed before you get up. ☐ You will receive supportive medicines for pain and nausea.

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Day 1

- ☐ Your care team will work with you to control your pain.
- ☐ You will begin taking pain pills instead of IV medicine.
- ☐ Do not get out of bed without help from hospital staff. You will begin getting out of bed and progress to walking in the halls with the help of your nurse.
- ☐ If needed, Physical Therapy will help in getting you mobile and provide you with exercises to do on your own.
- ☐ As your body recovers from surgery, you will slowly return to a normal diet.
- ☐ You will start your prescribed bowel regimen.
- ☐ Aim to spend at least 6 hours out of bed.
- ☐ Expect discharge from the hospital in the next 1-3 days.





- Days 2-4
- ☐ Your Foley catheter will be removed.
- ☐ You will get final discharge education on:
 - · Nutrition, with a dietician
 - Your medicines, with a pharmacist
 - Donor support, with the Living Donor Advocate
 - Confirming caregiving plan, with a social worker
 - Post-donation care with the Living Donor Nurse
- ☐ You will be able to understand and restate:
 - Your daily care goals and follow-up plan
 - · Your goal discharge date
- ☐ You will be taught how to care for your incision site and watch for signs of infection.

Goals

- ☐ Your pain is well-controlled with oral pain medicines.
- ☐ Able to sit up, stand up, and walk on your own.
- ☐ Able to walk safely up and down the hallways on your own 3 times a day.
- ☐ Return to a solid food diet.

Self-care / Follow-up

- ☐ Take pain medicines as needed: breakthrough medicines and scheduled Tylenol (acetaminophen).
- ☐ Perform bowel regimen, as needed. Do not go more than 48 hours without a bowel movement.
- ☐ Keep up with your food intake and protein goals. Small frequent meals or nutrient-dense snacks, until your appetite returns.
- ☐ Keep up with your ADLs and exercises, following activity precautions as prescribed.
- □ Nothing more strenuous than walking for the first 12 weeks after discharge.
- ☐ Do **not** lift anything that weighs more than 10 pounds. This is about the weight of 1 gallon of paint.

- ☐ Self-care:
 - Incision care, watch for infection
 - Breathing exercises
 - You may shower, but do **not** take a bath for 6 weeks.
- ☐ Know how and when to call the Transplant Surgery Care Team with questions or concerns
 - During business hours call your Nurse Coordinator, at 206-598-8134
 - After hours, go directly to UWMC Emergency Room
 - Have a low threshold to seek care. Call us if you have any concerns.
