Non-identified Donor Sperm Checklist

Tasks to do before insemination

This handout is for women who plan to become pregnant with sperm from a non-identified donor. It lists the tasks that must be done before insemination. This list meets Food and Drug Administration (FDA) requirements and American Society for Reproductive Medicine (ASRM) guidelines for use of donor sperm.

	Choose sperm bank	See handout "Donor Sperm Banks."
	Complete sperm bank paperwork, if required	URC fax number: 206.598.7080
	Decide what type and	Type: IUI, ICI or ART/IVF
	quantity you need	Quantity: You will need 1 vial for each IUI or IVF cycle. Buy more than 1 vial if you want more than 1 child with the same donor.
	Infectious disease screening for you and your partner (if partnered)	Test results are valid for 12 months.
	Genetic carrier screening is optional, but advised	Screening will tell you if you are a carrier for the same disease(s) as a prospective donor.
	Visit with fertility counselor	URC provides a qualified social worker.
	Order your sperm Be sure sperm is compatible with your cytomegalovirus (CMV) status	If you are CMV negative, buy only CMV negative sperm. If you are CMV positive, buy either CMV positive or negative sperm.
	Arrange shipment of sperm to Male Fertility Lab (see address below)	Complete lab consent form s . MFL fax number: 206.598.2807
