Buy these supplies at your local drugstore: ☐ 1 bottle magnesium citrate ☐ 2 Fleet enemas	At 5 p.m., drink the bottle of magnesium citrate.	 Starting 1 hour before you leave your house to come to your appointment: Give yourself 2 Fleet enemas. Follow the directions on the box. Give yourself the enemas 1 at a time. After you expel the 1st enema, repeat with the 2nd one. Give yourself 2 lukewarm tap-water enemas. After you expel the 1st enema, repeat with the 2nd. Bring a list of your medicines to your appointment. 			
	If You Have Sedation If you will have sedation (medicine to make you relax) for your sigmoidoscopy, follow these instructions in addition to the ones above: 1 Day Before On Test Day				
 Do a after night You liqu befor apportation 	 Do not eat anything after midnight the night before your test. You can drink clear liquids until 2 hours before your appointment time. After that, do not take anything by mouth. 	 Do not take anything by mouth starting 2 hours before your appointment time. This includes no chewing gum, smoking, or mints. Plan to arrive 30 minutes before your appointment time. An adult family member or friend must pick you up when you are ready to go home. You cannot drive, take a bus or taxi, or use a service such as Hopelink or Paratransit by yourself after your test. Your test will be cancelled if you do not have an adult family member or friend to take you home. We strongly advise that a responsible adult stay with you for the rest of the day.

Special Instructions

• **If you have diabetes:** Your diabetes medicines will need to be adjusted. Please talk with your doctor to plan a schedule for your diabetes medicines for the day of your procedure.

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What to Expect

- You are scheduled for a *sigmoidoscopy*. This test allows your doctor to look at the lining of the last part of your large intestine. Your doctor will place a flexible tube in your rectum. The tube is about the size of a finger.
- You might have some cramping during the test. Your doctor may take *biopsies* (tissue samples), but you will not feel this.
- The test takes about 10 minutes. Your appointment will last longer because of the time it takes to prepare for the test and to allow for your recovery.
- Your doctor will talk with you about the results. If results are not ready right after the test, your doctor will tell you when you can expect us to contact you.
